

Seminar organization and credit points

As the seminar will gather students from different programs and degree levels, the number of credit points depends on each student's situation.

Our seminar consists of 13 meetings, 6 of which will be in person and 7 of which online.

Participation:

You may miss **at most** 3 meetings. Attendance for the online sessions will be taken via Moodle. If there are any serious or urgent reasons, you can miss more than these three. Contact Dimitris as early as possible if something like this occurs.

Credit points

There are two ways to obtain credit points:

- Ungraded points (4 CP for EELP students):

Students are required to attend the course the minimal number of sessions and to undertake a 30-40 minutes group presentation of the respective session's assigned reading. The groups will be formed in due time and as soon as possible so that you have the maximum time for preparing your presentations. It would be good if you took a short look at the readings to see if you have some preference. Otherwise, the groups will be formed by lot. Look frequently at Moodle announcements so that the process runs smoothly!

- Graded points (6 CP for EELP students)

In addition to the above mentioned tasks:

o Submit a term paper. The paper's research question must have close connection to one (or more) topic or text treated during the seminar. The deadline for submission is the 31.03.2023.

OR

o Undergo an oral exam. Examination dates will be announced in the course of the semester.
