Tom pinches the straw again and blows down it to see if it still works. This makes bubbles in his glass and he calls on his father to admire. He


- 40 can be sure of his father's admiration. The mother mops her face and says in a resigned voice, "There, I told you it was all nonsense about him being thirsty."
