How do we want to describe the competences and which taxonomy we will use?

Competences document the specific ability to apply contents/concepts/methods, taking into account the level =>

- § Learning objectives of modules specify the overarching competence objective of the degree programme.
- § Learning objectives must be abstracted from the contents.
- § Learning objectives must be formulated in a verifiable manner.
- § Learning objectives are to be differentiated on the basis of the desired level

Understanding of competences

Oriented at the Qualifications Framework for Higher Education Qualifications

Differentiation between:

- § subject-specific competences ("knowledge and understanding")
- § interdisciplinary/generic competences
- § ("ability and knowledge development")
 - instrumental competence: "using instruments
 - systemic competence: "knowing how things work".
 - communicative competence: "communicate appropriately in relation to goals and occasions".
